





Born in France in 1966, Blexbolex entered art school with the intention of becoming a painter, but left having discovered his talent as a silk screen artist. He works regularly with book publishers in France and Germany as an illustrator and comic book artist. His work, which is inspired by vintage design, mixes old printing methods with new interpretations and techniques. Ballad is a story, and like all great stories it deepens with each retelling. The story builds over seven sequences. The first has three images: school, path, home. The next gives us: school, street, path, forest, home. The following five sequences take up this story, but with new words and images that nearly double the previous sequence. Here a child takes in her surroundings as she returns home from school, and by telling stories about what she sees, she makes her world bigger and more complex. This story is as old as the world. It happens every day.

With beautiful watercolor illustrations, Winston and George is the sto-

ry of a crocodile and a crocodile bird. These animals exist in a symbiotic relationship. Crocodile birds pick leaches and lice from the crocodile's skin and cry out whenever they see danger. In this story, Winston is a patient crocodile and George, though a prankster, is the best friend and crocodile bird that a crocodile could ever have. Still, their story is both

sweet and dramatic, for while Winston is willing to tolerate George's mischief, no-body else is. Could it be that community pressure will finally force Winston to eat George? Could he, would he do such a terrible thing?

John Miller spent much of his youth tramping about the woods and swamps of Morris County, New Jersey. Later, these adventures inspired his children's books and articles.




BENJAMIN CHAUD
